Sam Leanza joined with us in January this year but has been ill for some time and so I believe June's meeting was his first. Sam and Sheila live on

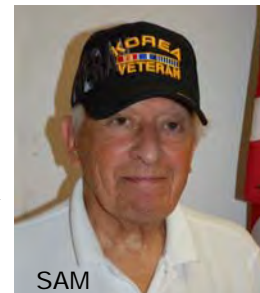
SE 175 Loop, Summerfield; Sam served with the Army's 24th ID, 2nd BN HQ in 1955-56.

As illustrated in the table on page three, Tell America (and other Chapter activities) takes money.

“Where do we get that money?” you ask. I say Tell America Fund Drives!

“Tell America Fund Drives; what are you talking about,” you say.

We used to go to supermarkets, set up a table and a sign or two and allow shoppers to contribute to our cause.

That was OK; it kept us going; well sort of!

But with a projected ex-

penditure of \$5,000.00 in School and other charitable contributions this year (we have already spent \$3,850.00! see page 3), that approach is no longer adequate.

And, it also does not take advantage of a Tell America opportunity; to meet with shoppers and tell them the “Who, When, Why, and So What” about the Korean War.

We have been gradually creeping in that direction.

But Saturday, June 23, Dwight Brown elevated us to

a new TA/FD level; he brought his exhibit items, and invited The Daily Sun and the Villages TV to come.

He got a pre-event notice in the Sun that our team would be at Colony Plaza. A reporter and photographer came to record the event, and produce a nice article in the following Sunday Daily Sun. There also was to be an appearance on The Villages TV as well.

And our TA/FD team took in **\$1,272.35**, the highest one-day yield ever. They gave out

three hundred of our Tell America Brochures (http://cid169.kwva.org/tell_america/Images/Brochure%2012-04-22.pdf).

That creates another level of fund raising—and Tell America—I think!

In the table above I summarize our fund raising efforts so far this year, and also begin to plan for fall 2012 events.

We always can use members to help us out with these drives; more later on this!
