Your Chapter at a very difficult crossroad, by Tom Thiel, President

Your Chapter is at a very difficult crossroad—continue as a viable, even leading Chapter, or dissolve. What is needed to continue are leaders — President, two Vice Presidents, and others.

Dissolution is a very sad prospect, and we will do all that we can to avoid it. But that cannot include me serving another term as President.

I have been your President for the last four years, and before that I was Secretary/Treasurer for at least that long. I have slowly begun to accept the fact that my health will not allow me to continue, even if the Bylaws permitted it (which they will when you approve the Bylaws revisions later this year).

To recap our situation, I asked Don

Van Beck to head up our Nominations Committee some time ago, and he and the Committee has met on a couple of occasions to date.

Most of the thrust of their early efforts were directed toward defining more precisely what needed to be done and by whom to keep the

Chapter trucking forward. This is what lead us to a very extensive reworking of our Bylaws, which broadly expands our ability to utilize people with special skills who are not otherwise eligible for KWVA Membership.

But the Committee has not come up with a slate of officers, which was to have been completed by our October Member Meeting. (Don is ill per voice mail on 10/24 after I left for the meeting.)

But there have been some efforts by others outside the Nominations Committee too.

Last week I sent 37 special letters mostly to members who joined most recently asking them to consider helping. I received no response!

And, on Oct. 25, Dwight Brown telephoned our eight Korean Service Veterans asking them to support him by considering filling the Vice President vacancies; none of them were willing to do so.

After our October 24 Member Meeting, I decided that we needed to take the following actions now.

The first is to appeal here in this Scuttlebutt for every member to dig down in their conscience and reconsider whether they might be able and willing to serve. At least you should learn what is involved with each position.

See www.cid169.kwva.org, click on the *Our Chapter* button and then on *Documents*.

It is important to point out that we are redesigning all positions so that the incumbents are not accepting great technological duties, but only serve to lead in keeping the Chapter running effectively (techie duties are to be done by Associates).

I am very confident this will work!

Additionally, I have: (a) scheduled a Board Meeting for Wed Nov 14 at 2:00 p.m. in the lunch room of the Sr. Center, (b) appointed all BoD members as members of the Nominations Committee, and waived the Procedures Manual requirement that none of these persons are interested in becoming an officer or member of the BoD; and (c) hereby ask you (all 87 of you!) who want to see your Chapter continue, and who might be interested in serving in any capacity, to also come to this BoD meeting.

I have every confidence this will work and that we can get a leadership team.

About \$28,000 is still owed contractors. You may help by buying a brick, \$60.00. You may have anything engraved on the bricks.

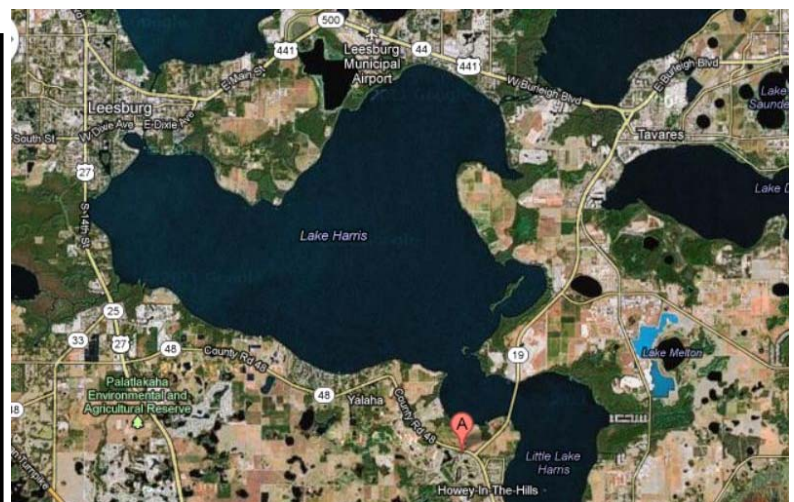
Art Canale is holding a fund drive for VMFP from 2-5 on November 10 at the Bowling Alley on West Main St. in Leesburg.

The Chapter very much appreciates the developmental work by all the ladies so far and encourages all ladies to become active in the program. We also have appreciated the refreshments!

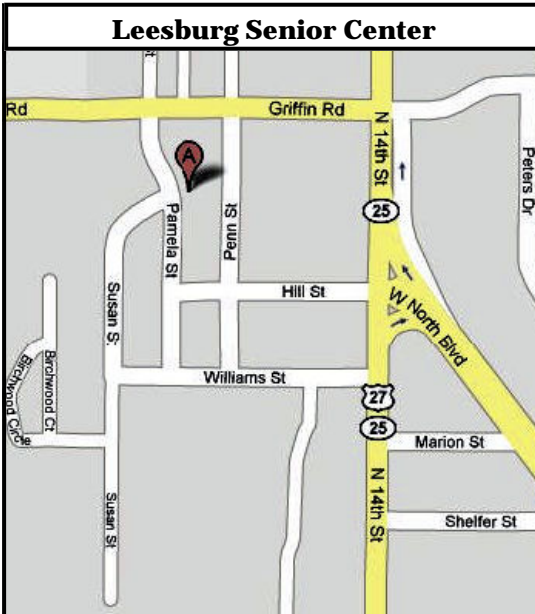
